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Transforming Potential Into Progress

2024/25 has been a year of establishing firm foundations and growth for the Artificial Intelligence Collaboration Centre (AICC).

We built a talented and diverse team at pace, drawing expertise from both industry and academia, with nineteen staff now in place across Belfast and Derry~Londonderry, greatly enhancing our ability to deliver.

Highlights include the roll-out of our Transformer Programme, with over 100 SMEs in our pipeline requesting support, the launch of Northern Ireland's first Al Capability Census, support for 260 postgraduate scholars and the introduction of new professional training programmes.

We've also convened flagship events such as Al Castle Conversations and taken Northern Ireland's Al story onto the global stage at Big Data New York and the Dublin Tech Summit. With our mandate extended to 2029, we now have the certainty and runway to deliver transformational impact; building Al skills, supporting innovation and transforming businesses.

The year ahead presents even greater opportunity and we are already working on additional opportunities with strategic partners to augment our core activities. We will continue to scale our support, strengthen our ecosystem and ensure Northern Ireland is recognised as a leader in responsible and impactful AI.

Key Action 1: Operations

Behind every successful initiative is a strong foundation. The AICC has built robust operations, a talented team and a clear brand presence to drive its mission forward.

Our team grew to nineteen staff in 2024/25, with roles across Business Engagement, Operations, Professional Services, Al Technology and Ethics, Data Science and Research, located across Ulster University's Belfast and Derry~Londonderry campuses and Queen's University Belfast. We're proud to have achieved 38% female representation, exceeding UK benchmarks for Al and technology teams.

LinkedIn followers, building our online community organically Our marketing and communications are delivering real impact. To date, we've reached over 67 million people through 98 positive media stories, while our LinkedIn community has grown organically from 480 in October 2024 to more than 3,600 followers, and continues to grow. Our refreshed website, featuring team bios, case studies, postgraduate course information, event updates and more, continues to attract strong engagement, with over 260 contact form enquiries generated.

Key Action 2: Training and scholarships

Building AI skills is at the heart of our mission. In 2024/25, we scaled up both academic and professional training to ensure Northern Ireland has the talent it needs for the future.

Through our fully funded scholarships, 260 students have enrolled across Ulster University and Queen's University Belfast. The first 17 graduates completed their programmes in summer 2025, equipped to take Al knowledge into the workplace. Two new MScs have been launched, Ethical & Responsible Al at Ulster University and Al in Business at Queen's University.

Professional training has also grown rapidly.
Our Al Acceleration Tour brought practical
Al workshops to communities across
Northern Ireland, attracting 269 participants.
Meanwhile, 106 professionals enrolled in our
"Driving Value from Al" course, with threequarters completing, a remarkable outcome
for a fully funded online programme.



I found the Driving Value from AI course really useful and it cemented some of the ideas I had like (I) I don't have to be a technical expert to participate in conversations, I need to bring my area of expertise to the table, (2) don't be afraid to ask questions to all people involved, (3) the regulatory changes that are coming in now align with what the experts delivering the course are saying about transparency etc. and that was comforting.

I found the aspects where we had to answer questions and could see other trainees' responses useful because it gave me a wider set of things to think about in terms of challenges they face and actual application of AI in businesses.

Key Action 3:

Ecosystem of collaboration and innovation

Al innovation doesn't happen in isolation. That's why the AICC is building a collaborative ecosystem, bringing together industry, academia, government and communities.


Events have been central to this effort, from the launch of our flagship AI Castle Conversations at Hillsborough Castle, which was supported by key industry partners, to national events such as Alan Turing Institute's AI UK 2025 and The Data Lab Scotland's DataFest. International showcases at Big Data New York and Dublin Tech Summit, and strategic partnerships, including with Innovate UK through BridgeAI. In total, we delivered 16 high-quality events, spanning local workshops to global stages, ensuring Northern Ireland remains part of the international AI conversation.

We're also formalising collaboration through an MOU with Momentum One Zero and have begun exploratory work with Belfast Region City Deal on Al related to the Digital Innovation Pillar, strengthening the foundations of our ecosystem even further.

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Key Action 4: Hands-on support for SMEs

Supporting indigenous SMEs is where the AICC makes a direct impact on increasing the region's productivity. Through our Transformer Programme, we provide up to 20 days of fully funded Al support from our in-house experts.

In 2024/25:

- → 18 AI and data science projects were completed
- ♦ 24 projects were in development
- ♦ 66 businesses were onboarding

These projects span multiple industries including healthcare, construction, cyber security, food production and legal technology. Each engagement accelerates innovation, builds confidence and ensures Al adoption is ethical and responsible.



Working with the Al Collaboration Centre through the Transformer Programme has been a game-changer for us. The hands-on support helped unlock 20 years of project data, streamlining our workflows and saving up to 90% of the time spent issuing drawings.

Beyond the technical solution, the collaborative whiteboarding, weekly check-ins, and expert guidance opened our eyes to what's truly possible with Al. It's been a lighthouse project for our practice, and a glimpse into what the industry has to offer.

Key Action 5:

Collaborative Research, Development and Innovation

Research and innovation are vital to making Northern Ireland a hub of AI excellence. The AICC has played a central role in securing and supporting collaborative R&D initiatives.



Major successes include:

- → Peace+ programme £5m allocated to Northern Ireland partners
- NILab doctoral training £7m to train future AI researchers
- Al Security Institute £200k funding secured

The publication of the Al Capability Census was a landmark achievement. It identified 198 firms active in Al, employing 1,340 professionals, and generating £82m GVA in 2024. With continued adoption, this could reach £200m by 2028. AICC has also collaborated on the new UK Artificial Intelligence sector study 2024 published by the Department for Science, Innovation & Technology (DSIT).

We will:

- Grow our research portfolio, building on R&D&I successes
- Host more community-building events such as AI Coffee Conversations

- ♦ Continue transforming SMEs through the Transformer Programme
- → Drive the conversation on Responsible Al regionally and internationally
- Strengthen complimentary engagements with regional City Deal, cross-border and national Al initiatives

With our extension in place to August 2029, the AICC is firmly positioned to help Northern Ireland harness AI responsibly, ethically, and at scale.
